Author coming to REAMS


Sponsored and fully funded by the Great River Regional Libraries, on April 21, 2022, author Mary Casanova is

With a Powerpoint program including images of Northwoods animals and book covers and illustrations, Mary will recount her journey growing up in a family of ten, struggling with reading, and discovering that books are a window into the world and writing is a way to "have a voice." Audiences of all ages engage with Mary's warm presentation style and respond with a greater desire to read--and write stories of their own. Educators appreciate that Mary regularly addresses the writing process: dealing with writer's block, drawing on personal experience, using the five senses; show, don't tell, and the use of conflict.



Introducing quadrilaterals to third graders

Third grade students learned all about geometry, especially quadrilaterals. They learned quadrilaterals are four-sided closed figures, like squares, rectangles, and rhombuses. To apply their learning, students in Ms. Engebretson and Ms. Reimann's classes created quadrilateral creatures together. Then they analyzed the quadrilaterals they used by looking at the shape's angles and sides to give the quadrilateral the best fitting name based on the criteria.



P.E. Teacher of the Day


