COVID tests STILL available

The Rockford Area School District was able to obtain more at-home, rapid COVID tests from the state for K-12 students. We will have these tests on hand for if/when your student develops COVID symptoms. These tests are available for your convenience. If you have already picked up a test in the past, you are still eligible for one additional test per K-12 student. We can send a test kit home with your child at your request. If your student is at home and you'd like to pick up a test, reach out to the building health office to set up a plan.

Annual student/registration update

This year, Rockford Area Schools has implemented an Annual Update which can be found in the Parent Portal in Infinite Campus. Keeping this information up-to-date will help families stay connected and be informed on upcoming plans and other important announcements. This **online update will replace the emergency medical form you have received in the past.** Most of the information will auto-populate from data already entered in Infinite Campus. Required fields are marked with a red asterisk(*) and information highlighted in yellow needs to be updated. There are also fields required by the Minnesota Department of Education such as technology access and ethnicity. We are asking all families to log in to your Parent Portal to complete this year's update AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. Going forward, the Annual Update will take place yearly in August. Fourth graders "Coming to America"

This week, 4th grade grammar students are reading about immigration to America through the history of Ellis Island and Angel Island. In the article, titled Coming to America, students learn about Ellis and Angel islands in the 1900s along with Ellis and Angel islands today. Students are learning about the tests, physical exams, and life of immigrants back in the 1900s when coming to America during the gold rush. At the end of the article, it tells students about how preserving our immigation history is important by making Ellis island into a museum and making Angel island into a state park/landmark. After discussing the article in depth, students compared and contrasted Ellis and Angel islands in the 1900s to today by creating and filling in two venn diagrams.
